President's Report

Being relatively new to POHA, and as I recently accepted the position of President following the February 2014 AGM, most of my time has been spent becoming acquainted with the history of our organization and getting to know the people who are and have been responsible for its' success.

It is apparent that we are a unique organization, run entirely by volunteers who are all driven by the single purpose of providing support for patients, who are going to have or have had open heart surgery.

In the past, the majority of the funding to cover the costs of educational resources used in our support endeavours, has come from the B.C. Government Community Gaming Branch. As we no longer qualify to receive these grants, we must develop other sources of revenue in order to maintain the same level of service provided in the past. At the same time we must be cognisant of the fact that for an increasing number of heart patients, English is not their first language. In order to effectively serve these patients we need to attract volunteers who are able to converse in other languages. And in addition, we need to upgrade our educational resource to include these languages.

I would like to thank John Sutherland, our hard working Treasurer, who has advised us that after many years of managing our accounting and finance requirements, that he wishes to take a well deserved rest at the end of this year. It will be difficult to replace John. We would appreciate and welcome anyone who would like to contact us to volunteer for this very important role on our board.

To all our volunteers and visitors, thank you for your past support and I hope for you ongoing support in helping us to maintain our mandate.

Interview with John Chesman – POHA President

This June, I had the pleasure of interviewing the new President of our organization, the Pacific Open Heart Association (POHA), John Chessman, about his lengthy career.

After 21 years as General Manager of MCL Motor Cars, John retired. He began his career working for H.B. Contracting as Controller and Treasurer. After that he had the privilege of working with the Vancouver Canucks as the Vice President of Finance and Administration, which he did for 15 years. Before starting with MCL Motor Cars, he worked for the Jim Pattison Group as Vice President of the Finance Automotive Group.

John was very successful in his professional career, but he was also very successful and involved in the community through various charitable organizations. He has spent 25 years as the Director of the Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Vancouver, he's been President of the Surrey Minor Hockey League, he has coached minor hockey and little league baseball, he was the Founding Director of the Canuck Foundation and he was President twice of the Vancouver Golf Club.

I asked John when looking back on his successful career and all his charitable work, what principles he thought were the underlying basis of his success and dedication. He stated that community and business go hand in hand with one another; meaning that being involved in the community helps business and business helps one to get involved with the community. Working for the Canucks lead him to be a founder of the Canuck Foundation and to be involved with the Boys & Girls Clubs. He strongly believes that you cannot be successful in life without giving back to your community.

Recently retired from his professional life, John is still very much involved with his community. He is a Director of several organizations such as Pacific Spine Research & Education and the Vancouver Golf Club, amongst a few others. He is also the Chair Person for our organization (POHA), as well as for the Justice Institute of BC and the New Car Dealers Association. I asked him what the driving force for him is to remain so involved with charities after all his years of service and he said that he's 74 years old and only retired at the age of 73, and that it gives him a sense of purpose during his free time, as well that it keeps his brain active, both lessons he learned from the loss of his best friend.

I wanted to know from John how he was first introduced to our organization and how he has seen our organization make a difference with patients. He's been a Board Director for us for three years. The first contact he had, like many of our members, was while recovering in the hospital from open-heart surgery and being visited by one of our visitors and current Board Director Rick Cozzoul. Rick explained a bit about POHA and this made John want to get more involved with us and the volunteer service that we provide. John was impressed by the POHA members because no one had any airs about them, and that the members are all good people who enjoy having fun, who aren't getting paid to do what they do, and that the work that all of the volunteers do is needed: helping people get over a time in their lives that for most is very scary.

We are very pleased and honored to have John Chessman as the new President of the Pacific Open Heart Association. He has received several recognitions including the Queen's Jubilee Medal for Distinguished Public Service, the Vancouver Canuck Alumni 7th man Award for Dedication & Support of the Canuck Alumni & Hockey Benevolent Association, as well as an Honorary Lifetime Membership of the Vancouver Golf Club. He brings with him a wealth of knowledge and experience, from which we are excited to benefit.
