Board of Directors


We are very happy to report that four people have joined the POHA Board of Directors:

Sound of Heart By Bill Turpin

Sound of heart? You might ask, "What does this mean?" We all understand "sound of mind and body". And, hopefully all of us, who have undergone cardiac surgery, are "sound of heart". But the term has several meanings for two current Board Members of The Pacific Open Heart Association.

Neither Marie Donatiello nor Patricia Tochkin has undergone cardiac surgery, but their involvement in the heart welfare of others demonstrates "heart" in several ways. While these ladies are both "sound of heart", each had a parent who had undergone cardiac surgery.

Marie's mother, Lily McCormack, was born in London in 1897 and moved to Toronto in 1901. As a young lady, she returned to England where she married and raised two children. Years later, after she had been widowed, Lily returned to Canada to be near her now adult children, When she was 92, Lily underwent double bypass surgery and also received a valve replacement. Lily lived to 101. Her daughter Marie recalls that her mother's "glass was always three-quarters full" and she was always "that friend indeed" for all of her friends and acquaintances.

Patricia's father, Don Brown, was born in Birmingham, England in 1919. When Don was four, his family immigrated to Winnipeg where Don spent his early years. During this time, Don was involved in a variety of activities with a focus on hockey and ice-skating at which he particularly excelled. In 1939 he married Helen, who would be his wife for the next 69 years, just before he enlisted in The Canadian Army. Don served for the duration of World War Two. Several years after he returned home, Don moved his growing young family to New Westminster where he became a member of The BC Provincial Police Force. When this group was absorbed by The RCMP, Don became an officer in this new force where he would eventually attain the rank of Inspector. After serving in Sherwood Park, Alberta, Don moved his family back to BC where they settled in Burnaby. It was here that Don really showed his "heart" for his community. Don was elected to The Parks Board, then The School Board and finally to The City Council. His service to Burnaby was recognized when Don was made a Freeman of The City. Don had triple bypass surgery in 1975 and during another subsequent surgery received several stents. After his bypass surgery, Don served as President of The POHA and was involved in hosting its annual Golf Tournament. This service to The POHA resulted in his receiving The Association's Don Topp Memorial Award.

So the "heart" that was repaired for each of their parents, coupled with the "heart" each of those parents shared with others, has resulted in Marie and Patricia putting their "hearts" into volunteering with local benevolent organizations and specifically as Board Members with The POHA. Marie is currently the longest serving Board Member with 18 years of service and is responsible for the popular pillows that all recipients of openheart surgery at Vancouver area hospitals receive. Patricia, who had volunteered at POHA golf tournaments and casino nights, has now committed even more time by serving as The Association's Secretary.

The "heart" these two ladies have demonstrated serves as an example for volunteers everywhere, but no more so than with the POHA.
