2,600 Clicks and Counting for 'Open-Hearter' Pair

A chance meeting in a hospital ward has led to a tight bond between two Ocean Park men that can only transpire through a shared medical triumph.

George Zukerman and Roger Phillips, both Ocean Park residents, met five years ago at Royal Columbian Hospital in New Westminster after they had undergone open-heart surgery.

Phillips, 67, was recovering with a repaired valve on his ticker and Zukerman, 83, was healing after a quadruple bypass. They met a few days after their surgeries during a post-op physiotherapy class at RCH, where therapists stressed the importance of walking to a speedy recovery.

"He was listening to Dvorak and I was listening to Mozart," notes Zukerman. Everyone was asked to introduce themselves and the name "George Zukerman" instantly rang a bell for Phillips.

"Are you the famous musician?" Phillips asked at the time. And I think I called him an oboist." "Bassoon!" bellowed Zukerman, as best he could under the circumstances.

"I had enough energy left to fight my perennial battle," he says, listening to the story Phillips was recounting near a walking trail in Elgin Park. "So then, with our interest in music, we ended up trading some CDs and found that we were virtually neighbours. After we were home, we agreed to meet up and walk three times a week," Phillips says.

Working up to their cardio-rehab walking routine was a painfully slow process. Just getting to the end of his driveway used to leave Phillips breathless, Gradually, though he was able to make it to the road and back and, over the passing days and weeks, both men grew increasingly stronger. "If you've got someone to walk with, it makes it a hell of a lot easier," Zukerman says.

Now, five years later, they figure they've walked about 2,600 kilometres – roughly the distance between White Rock and Saskatoon. They expect to reach the 3,000-kilometer milestone sometime next week during one of their thrice-weekly walks.

They walk Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, and their routes include the scenic paths along the beach, Sunnyside Acres and Crescent Park. They don't bother with pedometers; they prefer the tranquility of leisurely strolls.

Zukerman notes it was Phillips who made the mileage calculations. By his estimations, they have walked 650 times and, at an average of four kilometres per walk, that adds up to 2,600 kilometres – an impressive feat by any measure.

In gratitude to their medical teams, and the "incredible haute couture sewing" by the surgeons on their tickers (to use Zukerman's stylishly stitched phrase), the walking buddies volunteer at Royal Columbian Hospital with Pacific Open Heart Association, a fitting way to satisfy their desire to help others who are about to undergo open-heart surgery.

As former "open-hearters", volunteers share their own story and support new patients – pre-op and post-op – who are often bewildered and frightened by the prospect of heart surgery. "We can answer questions about recovery and perhaps family members' worries in a non-medical sense," says Phillips, a retired school counsellor.

"It shows people that your recovery is very much in your own hands, use what you've got and think positively," adds Zukerman.

What next for Phillips and Zukerman once they reach the big milestone?

"We figure that once we hit 3,000 kilometres and Saskatoon, we may as well set sight for PEI and lobster," quips Zukerman.
