A CHRONOLOGICAL LOOK AT OPEN HEART SURGERY AT VANCOUVER GENERAL HOSPITAL By Bill Turpin

The following time line has been developed with the assistance of Dr. Lawrence Burr, retired cardiac surgeon at Vancouver General Hospital (VGH).

1957 - Oct. 29: Doctors Peter Allen, Philip Ashmore, WG (Bill) Trapp and Ross Robertson performed the first open heart surgery at VGH Heather Operating Room #3 on nine-

year-old John Evans. The surgery, the repair of an Atrial Septal Defect, was described in a letter written by VGH student nurse, Norma Guttormsson who observed this first operation with the heart lung machine ever to be performed in B.C.

1960 - First permanent cardiac pacing was provided using epicardial wires and powered by a large pulse generator.1962 - First transvenous infraclavicular subcutaneous pacemaker implanted.

1962 - First artificial heart valve implanted.

1962 - First artificial permanent pacemaker inserted. **1967** - VGH took over the second and third floors of The Willow Chest Centre. This expanded space provided two large operating rooms with overhead viewing galleries, one regular-sized operating room, a 10 bed ICU, a step-down unit

plus pre and post-operative ward space. **1969** - June: First coronary bypass surgery performed by Dr. Peter Allen.

1972 - The cardiac surgery unit was temporarily moved to Shaughnessy Hospital while The Willow Unit was modernized. **1972** - First nuclear-powered pacemaker (A plutonium 238 power source was used in a Medtronic Model 9000 pulse generator) in Canada implanted by Doctors WG Trapp and Lawrence Burr.

1987 - The Jim Pattison Pavilion was opened providing contemporary cardiac surgery operating rooms coupled with ICU facilities.

1988, Dec. 6: First heart transplant surgery in BC performed by Dr. Virginia Gudas.

2003 - UBC Division of Cardiovascular Surgery established a cross-site cardiac surgical group between VGH and St. Paul's Hospital which in 2004 established a joint wait list for patients requiring urgent cardiac surgery resulting in a significant decrease in wait time for cardiac surgery in BC. **2005**- Dr. Peter Skarsgard established a minimally invasive valvular surgery program.

2008, Feb. 11: Doctors Richard Cook and Peter Skarsgard performed the first robotic surgery in BC using the fourarmed da Vinci "S" robot on a coronary bypass patient.

While the foregoing provides a very brief summary highlighting the development of open heart surgery at Vancouver General Hospital and mentions but a few of the dedicated medical professionals involved, the program's growth was not without its "diversions", two of which follow.

In 1957, after an invoice arrived for equipment thought to have been donated to the unit, an impromptu fund-raiser was held in a local legion hall where an evening of bingo was dedicated to raising the needed funds. At the time, bingo was illegal in Vancouver so when a police raid pushed its way through the front door, the event's enterprising organizer - a Mr. McDonald - bolted out the back door with the evening's proceeds in hand which he delivered to the Department of Surgery the next day.

On another occasion a surgery had to be put on hold when it was discovered that the perfusionist (the attending doctor responsible for the heart-lung bypass machine) was in jail. During the previous evening he had been in attendance at the showing of a "blue" movie at a local union hall when the police arrived and he was hauled off to jail. It took the efforts of the whole surgical team appearing before a magistrate attesting to this doctor's good character and explaining that he was the only perfusionist in the program to have the doctor released after being chastised by the magistrate so that the planned surgery could begin.

POHA Donates to Local Hospitals

This past year, POHA has made a number of donations to local hospitals. Below are 3 pictures:

- 1. A donation of \$3000 being made to Peace Arch Hospital for the purchase of a sleeper chair.
- 2. A sleeper chair that has been purchased for Burnaby General Hospital.
- 3. A donation of \$2500 to Langley memorial Hospital for the purchase of Cardiac Educational DVDs.

Sleeper chairs can be reclined completely and used as a bed. They are available to family and friends of critically ill patients so that they can spend the night with the patient. Typically sleeper beds and educational DVDs cannot not be purchased through funds normally available to hospitals.
